PC Becoming Slow: Find resourcehungry program With your system full of programs, there will definitely be one or two programs that use lots of your resources, for instance, a ram.To find out, open the Task Manager. You can right-click your taskbar and select the "Task Manager" option or press Ctrl+Shift+Escape to open it. On Windows 8, 8.1, and 10. Click the "CPU," "Memory," and "Disk" headers to sort the list by the applications using the most resources. If any application is using too many resources, you might want to close it normally — if you can't, select it here and click "End Task" to force it to close.
