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# Jordanian Traditional Clothing

The traditional outfit typically worn by men:- is made out of a one piece full length dress called a “Thoub” and a scarf like cover. Women:- wear a full length handmade black dress designed in red patterns.



# Men clothing In Jordan

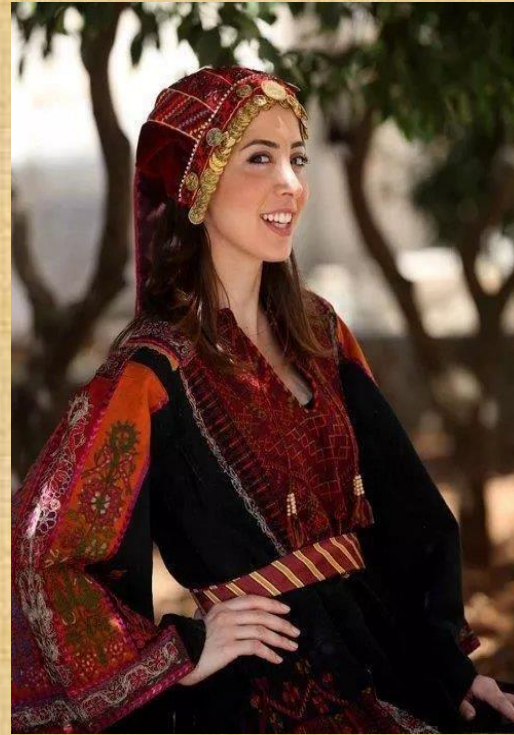
The “Thoub” is made out of white or grey cotton in summer to reflect sunlight, and darker, thicker textiles keep people warmer in the winter.





# Women Clothing In Jordan

The women national custom is a handmade black dress embroidered and designed with patterns in red.



# Traditional Clothing In Al-Salt (For Women)

The traditional clothing for women in Al-Salt is over 3 meters long called a “Khalaga”. It is then folded in layers to a head wrapping that is added to it. To many peoples surprise, it stays cool in the winter and summer.





# Clothing in Irbid

The traditional clothing in Irbid, Jordan is called the “Shirsh” it is the name for clothing in northern Jordan (in Irbid). They typically have long, tight sleeves and a low, embroidered neckline, and are the same length all around. The sides and hem of the outfit are also elaborate embroidered with lovely motifs.



# Clothing In Al-Karak

The traditional dress in Al-Karak is characterized by a long rectangular opening slit or a decorative panel on front of the dress. The dresses are made often using colors like gold, red and black with intricate designs.
