There are different sentence types based on the number and type of clauses in a sentence. A clause has a subject and a predicate.

A <b>simple sentence</b> is made up of one independent clause. An independent clause has a subject and predicate and can stand alone as a complete thought.	Jamar and I spent all day at the park by the river.		
A <b>compound sentence</b> is made up of two independent clauses joined by a coordinating conjunction such as <i>and</i> , <i>but</i> , <i>or</i> , or <i>so</i> .	The sky filled with clouds, and raindrops scattered across the fields.		
A <b>complex sentence</b> is made up of an independent clause and a dependent clause. The dependent clause might start with a subordinating conjunction like after, although, because, before, if, since, unless, until, when, and while. It might also start with a relative pronoun like that, which, who, whom, or whose.	If you get the chance, you should hike to the top of Mission Peak.		
A <b>compound-complex sentence</b> is made up of two or more independent clauses and one or more dependent clauses.	Sandra's computer broke, so she's borrowing Jeff's old laptop until she can get it fixed.
