


## The /k/ sound

## Spelling the /k/ sound

Some sounds are the same, but are formed by different letters. For example, the letters ck, k, ke, c and que at the end of words all make a /k/ sound.

- When the /k/ sound comes straight after a short vowel sound, we usually spell it **ck** as in sa**ck**, pe**ck**, thi**ck**et and socket.
- When the /k/ sound comes after another consonant, we usually use **k** as in bas**k**et, sil**k**, blan**k** or par**k**.
- When the /k/ sound is in the middle of a split digraph (e.g. **a-e**, **o-e**, **i-e**), we usually use **k** as in rake, snake, poke or spike.
- Some words originally came from the French language and end with a /k/ sound made by que. Examples of this include antique or unique.
- Look at lines 1-5 of Peter and the Wolf (Part 2) again. How many different letter formations of the /k/ sound can you find? come, twinkling, cat, frantic, duck, quacked, panic, could.
- Write five more examples of words with the spelling ck.
   Write five more examples of words with the spelling k.
