All About Sea Turtles

Size and Weight of Sea Turtles

There are many different types of sea turtle, and their appearance differs between species. The smallest type of sea turtle is the Olive Ridley turtle which varies between 51 to 75cm in length and 73 to 110lbs in weight. The largest type of sea turtle is the Leatherback turtle which measures 1.2 to 1.8m in length and between 441 and 1,984 lbs in weight.

Appearance of Sea Turtles

Sea turtles have a streamlined shell to make it easy for them to swim in the water. Their heads can vary in shape and size, for example, a hawksbill sea turtle has a narrow head suitable for digging into crevices in coral reefs for food. Instead of limbs, turtles have flippers so they can swim. Because of this, turtles are awkward on land and find it difficult to move from place to place. Land turtles can retract their limbs under their shells, but sea turtles cannot. They have four flippers - the front two are like paddles and the back two limbs help them to dig nests in the sand and keep the turtle stable as it swims.

Sea turtles have hard, bony shells which protect them from predators. The top side of the shell is called the 'carapace'. The carapace can be oval or heart-shaped, depending on the species. Turtles have no teeth or ear openings. Between species, the jaw shape of sea turtles varies due to their differing diets. They have big upper eyelids which serve to protect their eyes.

Did You Know...?

Green sea turtles can hold their breath for five hours!

Diet

Depending on their species, sea turtles can be:

- carnivores (meat eaters);
- herbivores (plant eaters);
- omnivores (meat and plant eaters).

A sea turtle's jaw structure indicates what kind of diet it has.

Scissor-like jaws: Leatherback turtles have delicate scissor-like jaws which are designed to eat soft foods like jellyfish.

Serrated lower jaws: Flatback turtles have serrated jaws designed for eating invertebrates like sea shrimp, jellyfish and sea cucumbers. Blunt jaws: Loggerhead sea turtles have jaws suitable for grinding and crushing a variety of prey, such as crabs, mollusks and plants.

The diet of a green sea turtle changes throughout its life. Until sea turtles reach 200mm in length, they are carnivores, eating mostly worms, crustaceans, insects and algae. As they grow, sea turtles tend to eat only sea grass and algae, making them herbivores.

Migration

Sea turtles migrate between cooler and warmer waters, depending on the season. They travel to tropical and subtropical climates. When they migrate, sea turtles can travel thousands of miles between foraging grounds and nesting beaches. These beaches are usually where they were born. Nobody knows how turtles find their way back to the beaches where they were born, but researchers believe that ocean currents and water chemistry provide clues for them.


Did You Know...?

Leatherback sea turtles can travel as many as 10,000 miles or more each year between foraging grounds in search of jellyfish.
