

## **Using and spelling adverbs**

### **Answers**

- 1.** Accept any appropriate adverbs such as: slowly, ponderously, majestically, heavily.
- 2.**
  - a.** Powerfully, joyfully, thoughtfully
  - b.** Totally, fatally, locally
  - c.** Immediately, completely, rarely
  - d.** Greasily, messily, prettily
  - e.** Terribly, comfortably, sensibly

## Using adverbial phrases

### Answers

1. The prepositions are: across, with, without, for, after, over.
2. Expected responses are: carefully, hungrily, patiently. However accept alternative, reasonable responses.
3. How – 'without the food'. How long – 'for a while' and 'after a long wait'. Where – 'over a table leg'.
4. The story will work best as a first-person narrative and should include anecdotes of the ups and downs of the day. It might be more amusing if you restrict the stories to around 100 words and ask students to relay anecdotes from their stories to the class. Perhaps ask each student to invent an incident – a waiting calamity – that isn't featured in the Student Book.
