

Spelling adverbs – exceptions to the rule

Page 16 of the Workbook teaches students about some adverbs that don't follow the rules (e.g. good, bad). They practise using *well*, *worse* and *better*. This is not extensive and may serve as a useful end-of-lesson activity rather than as a homework assignment.
