Objective/s:

- Identify simple present and simple past tenses.
- Use simple present and simple past tense in affirmative, negative, questions and short answers.

Simple Present Tense:

	<u>Subject</u>	<u>Main Verb</u>	
<u>Affirmative</u>	I/ We/You/They	go	to bed early.
	He/She/It	goes	
<u>Negative</u>	I/We/You/ They	don't go	to bed early.
	He/ She/ It	doesn't go	
<u>Question</u>	Do	I/ you/we/they go	To bed early?
	Does	he/she/it go	To bed early?
<u>Positive Short Answer</u>	Yes, I/we/you/they do.		
<u>Negative Short Answer</u>	Yes, he/she/it does.		
<u>Negative Short Answer</u>	No, I/we/you/they don't.		
	No, he/she/it doesn't.		

*Use the Present Simple for:

1. Daily routine:

- I go to school **every** day.
- Every morning, **he wakes** up, **washes** his face and **brushes** his teeth.

2. Habits: Use adverbs of frequency: (always, usually, sometimes, often, hardly ever, never)

- I **always** call my parents on Sundays.
- I **often** go to the cinema.
- He **usually** doesn't like going to bed early.

3. Facts:

- The sun rises from the east.
- The planets go around the sun.

*Third person: Add (s) to the verb in the affirmative form after he, she or it.

*The rules of adding third person singular (s):

1. Adding (-es):

*With verbs that end in (ch, sh, x, o, z, or s) : add (-es)

- He **watches** TV every night.
- She **washes** her face every morning.
- A mechanic **fixes** cars.
- He **goes** to school every day.
- The bee **buzzes**.
- He **misses** his family a lot.

2. Adding (-ies):

- With verbs that end in a **consonant** and (y): delete (y) and add (-ies):

- The student studies well for his exams. (study)

- With verbs that end in a **vowel (a, e, i, o, u)** and (y): keep the (y) and just

add (-s):

- He plays football on Tuesdays.

*The form of “have” after (he/she/it) is “has”.
