
<u>Pronouns</u> <u>Grammar Sheet</u>

• What is a pronoun?

- → A pronoun is a word that stands in for a noun, <u>often to avoid the</u> <u>need to repeat the same noun over and over.</u>
- Like nouns, **pronouns** can refer to <u>people</u>, <u>things</u>, <u>concepts</u>, <u>and places</u>. Most sentences contain at least one noun or pronoun.
- For example:
 - → I asked her if the headphones were hers, but she said they belonged to someone else.

• There are different types of pronouns:

- 1. Personal Pronouns
- 2. Possessive Pronouns
- 3. Reflexive Pronouns
- 4. Relative Pronouns

















• Personal Pronouns:

- → replace the name of a person or a thing.
- → such as: I, you, he, she, it, we, and they (Subject pronouns) me, him, her, us, and them (Object pronouns)

For example:

We would like to invite Stacy to join us for dinner.

• Possessive Pronouns:

- → replace a noun in a sentence but also show ownership.
- → such as: Mine, Ours, Hers, His, Theirs, and Yours.

For example:

I didn't have my umbrella so Marta lent me hers.

David's car is faster than **mine**.

• Reflexive Pronouns:

- → are used to refer back to the subject (person/thing).
- → <u>such as:</u> myself, yourself, himself, herself, itself, ourselves, yourselves and themselves.

For example:

I hope you enjoy yourselves at the party tonight!

We need to believe in **ourselves** more.











• Relative Pronouns:

- → are used to describe or limit the subject.
- → such as: who, whom, which, whose, and that.

For example:

The man **who** donated this money is my brother.

Kate, **whose** sister I used to share a house with, has gone to work in Australia.
