Examples: crash → crashes

patch → patches

mass → masses

church → churches

Examples: $leaf \rightarrow leaves$

loaf → loaves

life → lives

Examples: $baby \rightarrow babies$

body → bodies

 $memory \rightarrow memories.$

radio → radios

stereo → stereos
