Singular and Plural Nouns

Objective: to spell plural nouns correctly.


Singular Noun Definition: When a noun means one only, it is said to be singular. Examples: boy, girl, book, church, box.


Plural Noun Definition: When a noun means more than one, it is said to be plural. Examples: boys, girls, books, churches.

Plural noun rules

There are many plural noun rules, and because we use nouns so frequently when writing, it's important to know all of them! The correct <u>spelling of plurals</u> usually depends on what letter the singular noun ends in.

1. <u>To make regular nouns plural, add –s to the end.</u>





3. If the noun ends with -f or -fe, the f or -fe are often changed to -ve before adding the -s to form the plural version.



chief – chiefs

4. If a singular noun ends in -y and the letter before the -y is a consonant, change the ending to -ies to make the noun plural.

city – cities

puppy – puppies





- 5. If the singular noun ends in -y and the letter before the -y is a vowel, simply add an -s to make it plural.
- ray rays

boy – boys



tomato

tomatoes

6. If the singular noun ends in -o, add -es to make it plural.

potato – potatoes

tomato – tomatoes

- **Plural noun exceptions**
- photo photos
- piano pianos
- halo halos

volcanoes

volcanos

gas – gases (gasses is also acceptable but less common)

With the unique word *volcano*, you can apply the standard pluralization for words that end in –o or not. It's your choice! Both of the following are correct:

Rules for Plural Nouns
Most nouns add <mark>s</mark> to form plural
Nouns that end with <u>sh</u> , <u>ch</u> , <u>x</u> , <u>z</u> , or <u>s</u> add <mark>es</mark>
Nouns end with <u>vowel + y</u> , add <mark>s</mark>
Nouns end with <u>consonant + y</u> , change y to i and add <mark>es</mark>
Nouns that end with <u>f</u> or <u>fe</u> , change f or fe to ves
Nouns end with <u>vowel + o</u> , add s
Nouns end with <u>consonant + o</u> , add <mark>es</mark>
