## Quantifiers

We use **quantifiers** when we want to give someone information about the number of something: how much or how many. There are three main types of quantifiers:

1 Quantifiers for countable nouns. For example: (not) many, each, either, (a) few, several, both, neither, fewer, a couple of.

Examples: Several balls bounced over the fence.

I gave **each** of my friends an invitation.

2 Quantifiers for uncountable nouns. For example: (not) much, a bit, a little, a great deal of (used with abstract nouns like time or money).

Examples: We don't have much milk left.

Nan gave her a great deal of money on her birthday.

3 Quantifiers for both countable and uncountable nouns. For example: all, some, more, a lot of, enough, any, most, lots of, less, plenty of.

Examples: Laksari has lots of friends.

Armeena has **plenty of** pencils. I can't go out – I've got **no** money.

We usually use the quantifier **some** in positive sentences and questions, and the quantifier **any** in negative sentences and questions.

Examples: We have some pets at home.

I saw **some** dolphins on holiday.

We don't have any pets.

I didn't see any dolphins on holiday.

We saw **some** iguanas at the zoo, but we didn't see **any** giant tortoises.

However, we can use **some** for offers and requests.

Examples: Would you like some squash?

I would like **some** water, please.
