Vincent van Gogh

Early Life

Vincent van Gogh was a famous Dutch painter. He was born on 30th March 1853 in the Netherlands and was one of six children. He was extremely close to his younger brother, Theo. Vincent worked in a variety of jobs, including as a teacher and a shop assistant, before he became an artist at the age of 27. Today, his work is incredibly popular and loved by many people but he was not famous during his lifetime.

Inspiration

Vincent's earliest artworks were sketches that he drew using pencils or charcoal. In the early part of his career, lots of Vincent's work used very dark colours. Theo worked in an art gallery in Paris, France. He wrote letters to Vincent and told him
















all about a new style of art called impressionism, which was different to earlier styles of art which had focused on realism.

In 1886, Vincent moved to Paris to learn about this new style. His paintings began to feature brighter colours and his brushwork became more broken as he developed the style that he is famous for, known as post-impressionism.

Arles

In 1888, Vincent relocated to Arles in the south of France. He lived in a vibrant yellow house and invited other artists to join him. Vincent loved the blue skies, colourful landscapes and the bright sunshine of Arles and his paintings became brighter too. In Arles, he painted many scenes of the French countryside. Vincent also painted people, including more than 30 self-portraits, but perhaps two of his most famous paintings are 'Sunflowers' and 'Starry Night'. He actually painted eleven sunflower paintings and most of these were when he was living in Arles. He died on 29th July 1890 in France.


