| <b><i>Short answers</i></b>       |
|-----------------------------------|
| Yes, he did. / No, he didn't.     |
| Yes, she did. / No, she didn't.   |
| Yes, it did. / No, it didn't.     |
| Yes, I did. / No, I didn't.       |
| Yes, you did. / No, you didn't.   |
| Yes, we did. / No, we didn't.     |
| Yes, they did. / No, they didn't. |

### spelling:

- Regular verbs ending in a silent -e take /-d/ in the simple past and past participle.

Close

Closed

- Regular verbs ending in a vowel + y take /-ed/ in the simple past and past participle.

Play

Played

- Regular verbs ending in a consonant + y take /-ied/ in the simple past and past participle (the y becomes an i followed by /-ed/).

Marry

Married

- All the other regular verbs take /-ed/ in the simple past and past participle.

Visit

### Use:

We use the past simple for:

1. A completed action in the past.

I **saw** a movie yesterday.

Last year I **traveled** to Japan.

She **didn't go** to school last week.

2. A series of completed actions.

I **finished** work, **walked** to the beach, and **found** a nice place to swim.

**Did** you add flour, **pour** in the milk, **add** sugar, and then **add** the eggs?

Yesterday I **went** to the library, **met** a friend for lunch, and **played** tennis.
