Positive: Subject + verb / verb + s/ es /ies +..... +.

Negative: Subject + don't / doesn't + V.1 + ..... +.

Question: Do / Does + subject + V.1 + ..... +?

Positive
He walks
She <b>walks</b>
It walks
I walk
You <b>walk</b>
We walk
They walk

Negative
He doesn't walk
She doesn't walk
It doesn't walk
I don't walk
You <b>don't walk</b>
We don't walk
They don't walk

Question
Does he walk?
Does she walk?
Does it walk?
Do I walk?
Do you walk?
Do we walk?
Do they walk?

Short answers
Yes, he does. / No, he doesn't.
Yes, she does. / No, she doesn't.
Yes, it does. / No, it doesn't.
Yes, you do. / No, you don't.
Yes, I/we do. / No, I/we don't.
Yes, we do. / No, we don't.
Yes, they do. / No, they don't.

## Spelling rules (3<sup>rd</sup> person singular affirmative)

## Only with He / She / It

• Most verbs take -s in the third person singular.

I work
He works

Verbs ending in -ss, -sh, -ch, -x or -o take -es.

I miss I wash I watch

He misses He washes He watches

I fix I go

He fixes He goes

Verbs ending in <u>consonant</u> + y drop they -y and take -ies.

I c<u>ry</u>

He cries

• But verbs ending in vowels +y take -s.



#### <u>Uses</u>

We use the present simple for:


#### 1. Permanent states.



We live in Jordan.

Tom works in a school. He is a teacher.

## 2. Daily routine.



I leave work at 5 o'clock.

I usually wake up at 7:30.

## 3. Repeated habits.



She goes to the gym every evening. He usually swims on Sundays.

4. General truths and laws of nature. (Facts)

The sun sets in the west.

Water freezes at 0 C.

5. Time tables which we can't change.



The first flight to London leaves at 9 am.

The match finishes at 7:45.

Time expressions used with the present simple (Keywords):

Every hour /day / week / month / summer / year.

On Sundays / On Mondays

Once a week / twice a month / daily

Adverbs of frequency: always / usually / often / sometimes / rarely / never

Adverbs of frequency are used before <u>main verbs</u> but after <u>verb</u>
 to be.

He always goes to school.

He <u>is always</u> late.

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Note: Verb (be): am / is / are

Verb (have): have / has

Q1) Form sentences in the positive, negative, question and short answer. Use the present simple and write the use of each sentence in the brackets.

1. She / play / basketball on Saturdays. (Repeated habit)

Positive: She plays basketball on Saturdays.

Negative: She doesn't play basketball on Saturdays.

Question: Does she play basketball on Saturdays?

Short Answer: Yes, she does. / No, she doesn't.

2. My parents / work / in a big company. (Permanent state)

Positive: My parents work in a big company.

Negative: My parents don't work in a big company.

Question: Do my parents work in a big company?

Short Answer: Yes, they do. / No, they don't.

3. The plane / leave / at 8 am. (Time table )

Positive: The plane leaves at 8 am.

Negative: The plane doesn't leave at 8 am.

Question: Does the plane leave at 8 am?

Short Answer: Yes, it does. / No, it doesn't.

4. The sun / rise / in the east. (Fact)

Positive: The sun rises in the east.

Negative: The sun doesn't rise in the east.

Question: Does the sun rise in the east?

Short Answer: Yes, it does.

5. I / go / to sleep at 9 pm. (Daily routine)

Positive: I go to sleep at 9 pm.

Negative: I don't go to sleep at 9 pm.

Question: Do you go to sleep at 9 pm?

Short Answer: Yes, I do. No, I don't.
