- 4. How do we know that the den is uncomfortable?

 'there wasn't room for us both to lie down so we were sitting crouched together.'

 - 'The moon slid away from the clouds.'
- 6. Where does the fox come from? What does it do?
 - The fox came out of a whole, stood very still, and seemed to be looking at the narrator.
- 7. Give the meaning of the words underlined so that they mean the same as in the passage.

- b. 'till my eyes were <u>blurring</u>' until my eyes lost focus, so I could not see the fox properly.
